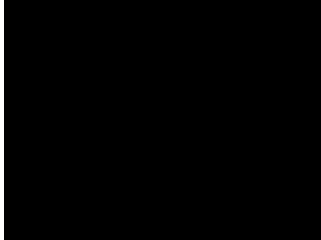
Recent Protests Significant to Transit

- Massachusetts Bay Transit Authority (MBTA), "T" – Aug. 2017

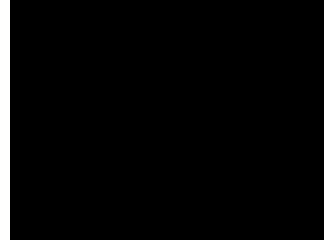




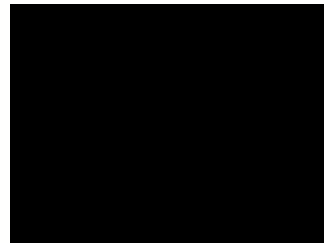

Portland Election 2016 Significant Protests

11/25/16:

- **PSU Student Anarchists.**
 - 12:00pm @ PSU.
 - Unknown amount of people.
 - This is a feeder march for the BLM protest.
- **Don't Shoot PDX/Black Lives Matter.**
 - 1:00pm @ unknown location, Pearl District maybe.
 - 1,300+ people expected.
 - Potential march and tree lighting ceremony disruption.
- **Portland Resistance.**
 - 2:00pm @ Justice Center.
 - Unknown amount of people expected.
 - Potential feeder march for the BLM protest.



Portland Election 2016 Significant Protests

11/26/16:

- **Portland Resistance.**
 - 6:30pm @ Pioneer Square.
 - 235 people expected.
 - Potential march, currently disorganized, no clear message/intent.



Portland Election 2016 Significant Protests

11/30/16:

- **Portland Resistance.**
 - 2:00pm @ City Hall.
 - >50 people expected.
 - Likely to be stationary at this time.

Portland Election 2016 Significant Protests

12/1/16:

- **PSU International Socialist Organization.**
 - 7:00pm @ PSU - Smith Hall.
 - 60+ people expected.
 - Likely to be stationary at this time.

Portland Election 2016 Significant Protests

1/20/17:

- **Oregon Anarchy.**
 - 10:20pm @ Pioneer Square.
 - <20 people expected (200+ interested).
 - Potential march with high aggression. Violence and/or property damage likely.
 - Intended to express anger over Trump becoming President.



Impacts

11/25/16:

- Blocked tracks. People in the ROW. TriMet property vandalized and personnel harassed. Increase in fights on trains. Customers stuck on trains/buses. Increased amount of "Red Knobs". Rioting forcing police use of less-lethal options (i.e. CS, OC, Pepper Balls, etc.). Significant service delays/disruption.

11/26/16, 11/30/16, 12/1/16:

- Blocked tracks. People in the ROW. TriMet personnel harassed. Customers stuck on trains/buses. Increased amount of "Red Knobs". Rioting forcing police use of less-lethal options (i.e. CS, OC, Pepper Balls, etc.). Significant service delays. TriMet property damaged.

1/20/17:

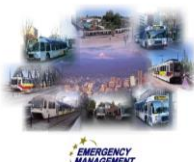
- Blocked tracks. People in the ROW. TriMet property vandalized and personnel harassed/assaulted. Increased amount of fights on trains and platforms. Rioting forcing police use of less-lethal options (i.e. CS, OC, Pepper Balls, etc.). Customers stuck on trains/buses. Increased amount of "Red Knobs". Significant service delays/disruption.



Emergency Management Tools

- All-Hazards Emergency Operations Plan (EOP).
- NIMS Compliant Incident Action Plan (IAP) using ICS forms.
- Individual Incident Command System (ICS) training for all employees based on the NIMS Training Plan as provided by FEMA.
- Close coordination and collaboration with stakeholder partners.
